FREE Internet Security Awareness Workshops

Calling all owners of small and medium businesses!

Two more FREE DTI-sponsored Internet Security Awareness courses have been scheduled for January and February 2007 at the Isle of Man International Business School.

The ISA course covers what is required in order to practice 'safe internet' and to improve awareness within your organisation. In the modern working environment a key requirement in order for businesses to be successful in the long and short term is I.T. security. However, many think that security is all about technology when it's not; it is about people and awareness.

In terms of Internet security, small-medium size organisations and individual consumers are the most vulnerable groups. In general, they are the least aware of the threats of cyber crime; have the least knowledge of the basic steps that can be taken to protect themselves; and have the least assistance available to them. In fact, in 2005, 67% of companies suffered a virus attack and less than 20% of companies carried out security audits – yet the average cost of a security breach was £30,000 (UK DTI survey).

So, businesses need to take responsibility for their own security policy. They need to increase awareness and education within their business of the threats posed by the internet and learn how to protect their business when on-line...
